## Homeless Services

We provide immediate, direct services to individuals, families, and veterans experiencing homelessness including comprehensive case management, linkage to medical, mental, and behavioral health care, job readiness, employment placement, education, and housing.



## Reentry Services

VOADV has a proven record of commitment and experience in operating community reintegration programs. We provide evidence-based treatment interventions to clients to reduce the risk of re-offending and promote successful reintegration in both residential and non-residential settings.



## Specialized Services

Our specialized services provide a structured and facilitative environment for individuals who are developmentally disabled, experience mental illness, or who have suffered traumatic brain injury. These programs offer individualized care with community-based services and therapies.



## Permanent Housing

The development of affordable and workforce housing units allows us to provide access to the freedom of independent living while fostering a communal support network and the continuation of vital social services to maintain a healthy living environment.



## Supportive Housing

Our specialized housing programs offer an array of supportive services to address each person's unique needs throughout the community. This includes individuals who have experienced chronic homelessness, as well as those with qualifying disabilities.

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
